

Exposure Gaps

- Adolescent brains are primed for learning through developmentally appropriate experiences
 - Exploration
 - Pro-social risk taking



Exposure Gaps

- The experience of foster care does not always provide this environment.
- Missed experiences result in missed opportunities to acquire knowledge and skill.




Why Coaching?



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



Assess: What are the students current strengths and challenges across Seven Life Domains?



Fostering Success Coach Model Application: APT

Prioritize: How can

the coach and student maximize the time in the session to meet the student's needs?

- Hierarchy of Needs
- Co-creating agenda



Fostering Success Coach Model Application: APT

Teach: What does the student need to know, understand, or do to move forward?

- Scaffolded skills teaching through creation of experiences
- Teaching, not just telling
